APPROVAL OF EXTENSION OF A PERMIT
TO PROSPECT FOR MINERALS
OTHER THAN OIL, GAS AND GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES,
INYO COUNTY

PERMITTEE: Queenstake Resources (U.S.A.) Inc.

PROPOSED AUTHORIZATION:

Approval of an extension of a permit to
prospect for gold, silver and other valuable
minerals other than oil, gas, geothermal
resources, sand and gravel on 320 acres of
vacant school land in Inyo County.

TERMS OF EXTENSION:

June 1, 1985 through May 30, 1986.

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

Approximately 320 acres of vacant school land
in the South 1/2, Section 36, T23S R42E, MDM,
Inyo County, 11 miles north of Trona.

PREREQUISITE ITEMS:

Application and statutory processing fees were
submitted by Applicant on May 14, 1985.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

A prospecting permit, PRC 6416, was approved
for issuance by the Commission on April 28,
1983, effective June 1, 1983. The permit
granted the Permittee an exclusive right for a
period of two years to prospect for minerals
other than oil, gas and geothermal resources.

CALENDAR ITEM NO. C12 (CONT'D)

During the two year period, the Permittee performed geologic mapping, rock chip sampling, data compilation and drafting. The original program approved the drilling of four holes, 200 to 400 feet deep; these holes are to be drilled during the one year extension of the permit. The delay in drilling seems to have been due to the lack of financial backing, now resolved by an expressed willingness of Tenneco Minerals, Denver, to participate in this program. The additional time requested to complete the original exploration program seems reasonable, and should allow a better assessment of the value of the State's mineral interest in this parcel.

The primary term of a Prospecting Permit is two years. The Commission may, in its discretion, extend the term for one additional year.

The renewal is in the best interests of the State.

A Negative Declaration was prepared by the Commission staff pursuant to CEQA and implementing regulations, and was certified by the Commission April 28, 1983.

The project is situated on lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1, and is classified in use category "C" which authorizes Multiple Use.

The agency which nominated the parcel as containing significant environmental values reviewed this project and found it to be compatible with their nomination.

ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA because the activity is not a "project" as defined by CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.

2. Any change in the proposed prospecting activities will require an environmental review pursuant to CEQA Regulations.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. FIND THAT A NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE PROJECT WAS ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSION ON APRIL 28, 1983 PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CEQA, THAT A DETERMINATION WAS MADE THAT THE PROJECT WOULD NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT, AND THAT SAID DOCUMENT AND DETERMINATION REMAIN VALID FOR THE PROPOSED ACTION.
2. FIND THAT THIS EXTENSION IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF CEQA PURSUANT TO 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15061 BECAUSE IT IS NOT A PROJECT AS DEFINED BY P.R.C. 21065 AND 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15378.
3. PURSUANT TO SECTION 6891 OF THE P.R.C., AUTHORIZE THE EXTENSION THROUGH MAY 30, 1986 OF PROSPECTING PERMIT PRC 6416 ISSUED TO QUEENSTAKE RESOURCES (U.S.A.) INC. TO PROSPECT FOR ALL MINERALS OTHER THAN OIL, GAS AND GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES; ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT ARE TO REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.
