OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Mineral prospecting permit PRC 6698 was approved for issuance to Utah International Inc. by the Commission on June 21, 1984 effective August 1, 1984.

Utah International Inc. performed detailed geologic mapping at a scale of 1:500 and rock geochemical sampling during the two-year period of the prospecting permit. The depressed mining industry has slowed Utah International Inc. in both their sampling and mapping. Utah International Inc. believes their preliminary results are sufficient to warrant additional work and they have therefore requested a one year extension of mineral prospecting permit PRC 6698 to continue additional geological mapping and geochemical sampling to prospect for valuable minerals. Staff recommends the one year extension is in the best interest of the State.

ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 6, Information Collection, 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2905(e)(3).

2. Pursuant to P.R.C Section 6895, upon establishing to the satisfaction of the commission that commercially valuable

deposits of minerals have been discovered, the applicant would have a preferential right to a lease for a maximum of 640 acres embraced within the permit. Said right shall be subject to all necessary environmental approvals. The permit will not affect the discretion of the Commission in granting or denying such environmental approvals.

TO PROSPECT FOR ALL MINERALS OTHER THAN OIL AND GAS AND GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES; ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT ARE TO REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

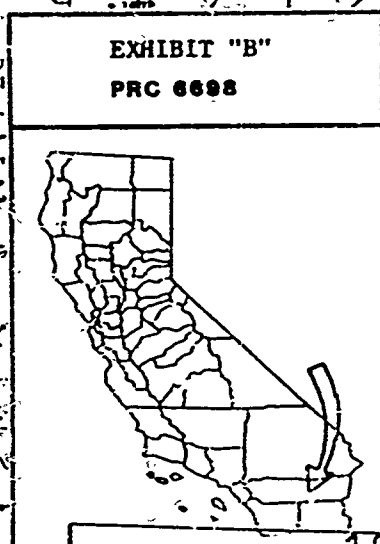
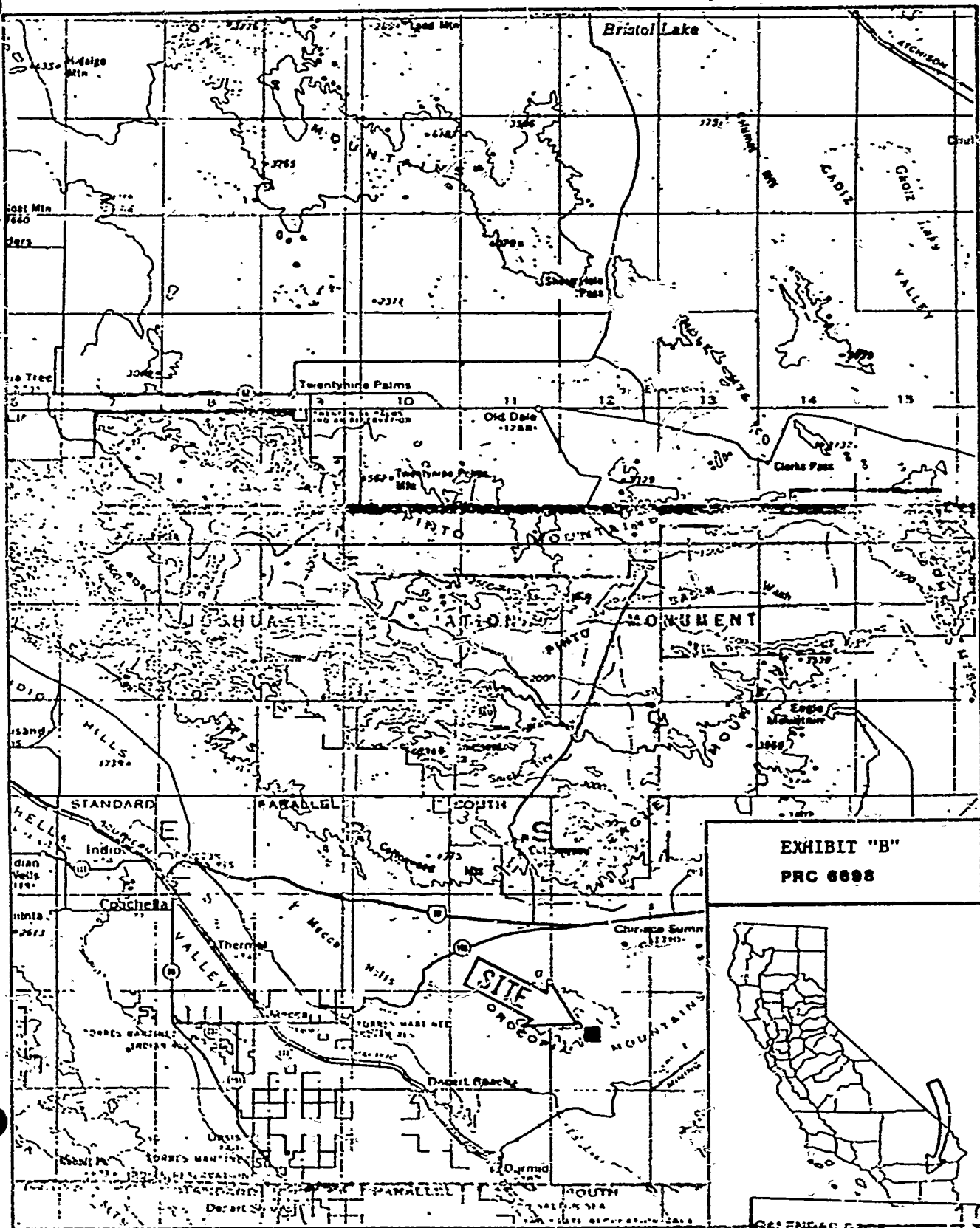
