GENERAL LEASE - RIGHT-OF-WAY USE

APPLICANT: American Telephone and Telegraph
Communications of California, Inc.

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:
A 0.230-acre parcel of submerged land located
in the Sacramento River near Redding, Shasta
County.

LAND USE: Installation and maintenance of a 0.5-inch
fiber optic cable to be attached to the
existing Highway 273 bridge structure.

TERMS OF PROPOSED LEASE:
Continuous plus one (1) year beginning July 1,
1988.

CONSIDERATION: Exempt by Law, Section 7901, Public Utilities

APPLICANT STATUS: Applicant is permittee of upland.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15025), the staff has prepared a Proposed Negative Declaration identified as EIR ND 442, State Clearinghouse No. 88041228. Such Proposed Negative Declaration was prepared and circulated for public review pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

Based upon the Initial Study, the Proposed Negative Declaration, and the comments received in response thereto, there is no substantial evidence that the project will have a significant effect on the environment. (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15074(b))

2. As part of a long distance telephone system, the Applicant proposes to install fiber optic cable from the State's lease area in the Sacramento River at Redding to Medford, Oregon. The cable crossing the Sacramento River will be installed in existing steel conduit on the Highway 273 bridge.
3. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$100 which is the minimum rental for this type of lease.
4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

LAND DESCRIPTION

W 24127

A strip of submerged land 20 feet wide in the bed of the Sacramento River, City of Redding, Shasta County, California, the centerline of said strip being described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the centerline of the California State Highway 273 bridge over the Sacramento River from which the southeast corner of Section 24, T32N, R5W, MDM, bears N 40°50'17" E, 7,876.09 feet; thence from said point of beginning N 38°07' E, 1000 feet to the end of the herein described line.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portion thereof lying landward of the ordinary low water marks of the Sacramento River.

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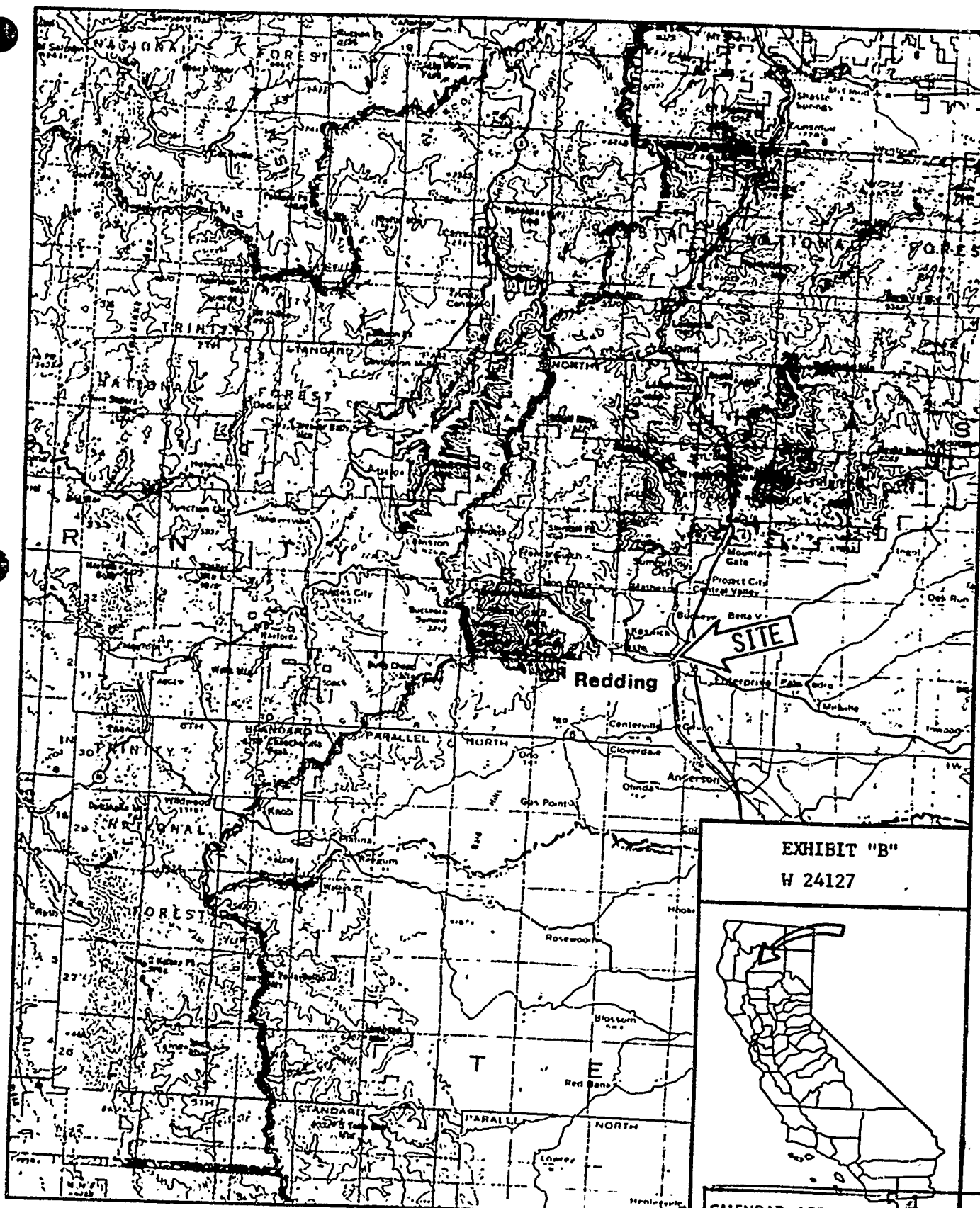

Project Title: AT&T Fiber Optic Cable - Redding to Medford Oregon
Project Proponent: AT&T
Project Location: From Redding to Shasta County, through Siskiyou County, to Medford, Oregon.

Project Description: Proposed placement of an underground fiber optic cable, mainly along existing AT&T right-of-way. The cable will be buried a minimum of 48 inches below the ground surface and will be approximately 155 miles in length. It will be encased in steel conduit under roads and waterways, and in PVC conduit when buried in rock. The applicant has amended its project proposal to include and provide: 1) a delineation of all affected wetland areas in the project area; 2) the completion of a biological survey for the proposed right-of-way in order to identify any sensitive, rare, or endangered plants; and 3) a commitment to comply with any mitigation measures developed by the Department of Fish and Game as a result of the information provided in the above investigations.
