OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
- 2. A Negative Declaration was prepared and adopted for this project, SCH #86052506, by the County of Sacramento. The State Lands Commission's staff has reviewed such document.
- 3. The County of Sacramento has an existing permit from the Commission for the maintenance and operation of a four-lane bridge structure spanning the American River. The facility is known as the Sunrise Boulevard Bridge.
- 4. The proposed project would add two lanes of traffic, one in each direction, to the existing four-lane bridge. The project represents the final link in creating a six-lane expressway between Highway U. S. 50 in Rancho Cordova and Greenback Lane in Citrus Heights. The Applicant and the staff have agreed to amend existing PRC 2393 to provide for said addition, effective June 1, 1991. With the additional lanes, the bridge will occupy 0.58 acre of sovereign land.

A strip of submerged land 110 feet wide situated in the bed of American River in Sacramento County, California, lying 60 feet on the right and 50 feet on the left of the following described line:


COMMENCING at a point on the centerline and the north end of the American River Bridge at Fair Oaks, said point being further described as "Engineers Station C 22+72 Fair Oaks Bridge Approach", from which a 1-1/4 inch iron pipe stamped LS 2217 bears N 23° 45'12" W 323.28 feet and S 59° 00'00" W 90.73 feet, said iron pipe marks the southeasterly corner of the lands of Harold A. Spellman being that portion of Lot 2, Block 40, Fair Oaks City, as shown on the "Record of Survey of Wilson Street Approach to American River Bridge" recorded September 8, 1955 in Book 11 of Surveys, Survey No. 41, records of said county; thence S 23° 45'12"E 357.00 feet more or less to the ordinary low water mark on the right bank of the American River and the POINT OF BEGINNING; thence S 23° 45'12" E 229.00 feet more or less to the ordinary low water mark on the left bank of said river and the end of this herein described line.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portions lying above the ordinary low water mark of said river.

REGRIIVE DECLARATION

Pursuant to Division 6, Title 14, Chapter 3, Article 6, Sections 15070 and 15071 of the California Administrative Code and pursuant to the Procedures for Preparation and Processing of Environmental Impact Reports adopted by the County of Sacramento pursuant to Sacramento County Ordinance No. SOC-116, the Environmental Coordinator of Sacramento County, State of California, does prepare, make, declare, publish, and cause to be filed with the County Clerk of Sacramento County, State of California, this Negative Declaration ra: The Project described as follows:

1. Title, Location and Short Description of Project: HIDENING OF SUNRISE BOULEVARD BRIDGE OVER THE LOWER AMERICAN RIVER The proposed project would add 2 lanes of traffic, one in each direction, to the existing 4-lane Sunrise Boulevard Bridge and the south road approach, and one lane to the south-bound lanes of the morth road approach. (One additional north-bound lane at the north road approach was included as part of the recently approved Sunrise Boulevard widening project, which will be constructed prior to completion of the current proposal.) The north road approach work limit is Fair Caks Boulevard. The south road approach work limits are South Bridge Street on the east side and opposite Gold Country Boulevard on the West. . The total length of the proposed profect is 0.5 mile and the existing bridge length is 0.19 mile.

The Sumrise Boulevard Bridge currently contains 4 lanes and spans the Lower Reserican River (River Mile 20.11) between Rancho Cordova and Fair Coks. The proposed project represents the final link in creating a 6-lane expressivay between U.S. 50 in Rancho Cordova and Greenback Lane in Citrus Heights.

- 2. Project Proponent: County of Sacramento
- 3. Said project will not have a significant effect on the environment for the following reasons:
 - a) It will not have the potential to degrade the quality of the environment, substantially reduce the habitat of a fish or wildlife species, cause a fish or wildlife population to drop below self sustaining levels, threaten to eliminate a plant or animal community, reduce the number or restrict the range of a rare or endangered plant or animal or eliminate important examples of the major periods of California history or prehistory.
 - b) It will not have the potential to achieve short-term, to the disadvantage of long-term, environmental goals.
 - c) It will not have impacts which are individually limited, but camulatively considerable.
 - d) It will not have environmental effects which will cause substantial adverse effects on human beings, either directly or indirectly.
