The State of California is a party to a condemnation action brought by the City of Oceanside entitled, <u>City of Oceanside</u> v. <u>Sutter et al.</u>, San Diego County, involving lands to be used as part of the San Luis Rey River Flood Control Project.

Upon examination of the Commission's records pertinent to the area, staff has determined that the area involved in the taking may include potential public interests lying in and connected to the San Luis Rey River. However, the intended uses would not be inconsistent with such interests.

Extensive preparation and research would be required by staff to determine the extent of such interest; that, even upon such determination, compensation for such interest would be nominal and the costs of proof outweigh any possible compensation the State would receive in the condemnation award.
