PRIOR APPROVAL OF ADDITIONAL TIDELAND OIL REVENUE
EXPENDITURES FOR SUBSIDENCE VERTICAL MEASUREMENTS AND STUDIES
LONG BEACH HARBOR DISTRICT
LOS ANGELES COUNTY
1991-1992 FISCAL YEAR

BACKGROUND:

Chapter 138/64 1st E.S. Section 1(e) authorizes the City of Long Beach, with the prior approval of the State Lands Commission, to expend tidelands oil revenues to remedy or protect against the effects of subsidence of the land surface within the boundaries of the Long Beach Harbor District. The City, through the Port of Long Beach, estimated \$245,000 as the cost for vertical measurements and studies (to monitor ground surface elevation changes) for the 1991-92 fiscal year (July 1, 1991 to June 30, The Commission granted prior approval on May 1, 1991 (Minute Item C21). On March 30, 1992, the Port of Long Beach requested prior approval of an additional \$20,000 to meet anticipated increased vertical measurements costs by June 30, The higher operating cost is due mainly to increase in security and safety restrictions, increased interference from fences and gates hindering survey fieldwork, and an increase in the port's personnel salary overhead rate. Funds being requested separately for FY 1992-93 also reflect an additional increase for similar reasons.

The increase would raise the prior approved subsidence costs for vertical measurements and studies for 1991-92 to \$265,000.




