DREDGING LEASE

APPLICANT:

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City of Richmond 2600 Barrett Avenue Richmond, California 94804

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

Granted minerals reserved lands at the Port of Richmond, Contra Costa County.

LAND USE:

Maintenance dredging of 28,500 cubic yards of material from Terminal 4 in the Port of Richmond to the required depths for commercial vessels using the facility. The material will be disposed at the Corps of Engineers approved Alcatraz site.

TERMS OF ORIGINAL LEASE:

Lease period:

Five years beginning October 1, 1987.

PROPOSED LEASE TERMS:

Lease period:

Thirty months with a beginning date of March 8, 1994.

Royalty:

No royalty shall be charged for material placed at the approved offshore site. A royalty of \$0.25 per cubic yard shall be charged for any material used for private or commercial purposes.

Filing fee and processing fee have been received.

- 1. The San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission (SFBCDC), a "functional equivalent agency" under Section 21080.5 and Section 15251(h) of the CEQA, has:

 - c. found that the project, as proposed, will not have a significant effect on the environment.

1. FIND THAT AN ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS DOCUMENT (BAY CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION PERMIT M-93-68 WAS CERTIFIED FOR THIS PROJECT BY THE BAY CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION UNDER ITS CERTIFIED PROGRAM (14 CAL. CODE REGS. 15251 (h).

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- 2. FIND THAT THE COMMISSION HAS CONSIDERED THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS PREPARED BY THE SFBCDC AND CONCURS WITH THE CONCLUSIONS AND FINDINGS CONTAINED THEREIN, 14 CAL CODE REGS., SECTION 15253.
- 3. FIND THAT THIS ACTIVITY IS CONSISTENT WITH THE USE CLASSIFICATION DESIGNATED FOR THE LAND PURSUANT TO P.R.C. 6370 SEQ.
- 4. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO THE PORT OF RICHMOND OF A THIRTY-MONTH DREDGING LEASE BEGINNING MARCH 8, 1994. SAID LEASE SHALL ALLOW DREDGING A MAXIMUM VOLUME 28,500 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL FROM THE PORT OF RICHMOND, CONTRA COSTA COUNTY. DISPOSAL OF THE DREDGED MATERIAL WILL BE AT AN APPROVED DISPOSAL SITE, AS AUTHORIZED. SUCH PERMITTED ACTIVITY IS CONTINGENT UPON APPLICANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PERMITS, RECOMMENDATIONS, OR LIMITATIONS ISSUED BY FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.
