ACCEPT THE FULL QUITCLAIM OF NEGOTIATED SUBSURFACE (NO SURFACE USE) STATE OIL AND GAS LEASE PRC 7706 (30 ACRES UNDER THE ACRES UNDER TREE SLOUGH) SOLANO COUNTY

### BACKGROUND:

Negotiated subsurface (no surface use) State Oil and Gas Lease PRC 7706 (Lease) was issued to ABA Energy Corporation (ABA) on July 19, 1993 and contains 30 acres of tide, submerged and proprietary lands in the bed and vicinity of Tree Slough in Solano County, California (leased lands). Under the terms of the Lease, the lessee is required to pay an annual rental of \$25 per acre (750 for 30 acres) and commence drilling operations on the leased lands within three years. An exploratory well was directionally drilled from an upland drillsite which bottomed under state lands. The exploratory well was a dry hole and subsequently abandoned in accordance with applicable regulations.

P.R.C. 6804.1 and Lease Paragraph 30 permit the lessee to make at any time a written quitclaim of all rights under the lease or of any portion of the leased lands comprising a ten-acre parcel or multiple thereof in a compact form. The quitclaim will be effective when it is filed with the State subject to the continued obligation of the lessee and its surety to pay all accrued rentals, royalties and liabilities under the lease prior to the effective date of the quitclaim.

On November 4, 1993, the Commission received the document "(Full) Quitclaim Deed for State Oil and Gas Lease". This document was dated October 7, 1993 and quitclaims to the State all of the lessee's right, title and interest in the leased lands described in Exhibit "A" of State Oil and Gas Lease PRC 7706 dated July 19, 1993.
