MINUTE ITEM

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APPROVE REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION FROM COMPETITIVE BID PROCEDURES FOR A SUBSURFACE OIL AND GAS LEASE ON COUNTY PROPERTY CONTRA COSTA COUNTY

APPLICANT:

County of Contra Costa Public Works Department 255 Glacier Drive Martinez, California 94553-4897

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

A 12.21 acre parcel of county land known as Delta Road and Byron Highway near Knightsen, Contra Costa County.

BACKGROUND:

The Capitol Oil Corporation (Capitol Oil) has requested Contra Costa County to enter into a subsurface oil and gas lease for county-owned lands underlying Delta Road and Byron Highway near Knightsen. Capitol Oil has leased and has an option to lease acreage surrounding the 12.21 acre parcel of county land. Contra Costa County has requested to be exempted from competitive bidding procedures in order to negotiate a lease with Capitol Oil which has offered to lease this parcel of land and has agreed to pay Contra Costa County a royalty of 20 percent for any hydrocarbons produced from this lease, and \$30 per acre per year rent with five years paid in advance. These terms are consistent with the surrounding private leasehold interests. Commission staff believes that the proposed terms are fair and reasonable.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:

P.R.C. Section 7052 states in part:

"The State Lands Commission may in its discretion exempt particular leases or operating agreements from the procedure required by this section and Section 7053...[competitive bidding procedure] where by reason of the small size of the property or drainage, actual or imminent, such procedure would in the judgment of the State Lands Commission in the particular case be impractical.

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CALENDAR ITEM NO. C76 (CONT'D)

Commission staff has reviewed the application of Costa County for a subsurface negotiated oil and gas lease with Capitol Oil Corporation and has determined that it would be impractical for Contra Costa County to follow the competitive public bidding procedures as outlined in Sections 7052 and 7053 of the P.R.C. because the parcel is small in size and the county proposes to develop the surface for other uses, there is no drillsite and the potential for drainage from adjacent lands under lease to Capitol Oil Corporation in imminent.



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EXHIBIT "B"

LAND DESCRIPTION

Furnished by Contra Costa County

PARCEL 1.

A forty foot wide strip of land being a portion of a county road known as Delta Road.

Commencing at the corner common to Sections 4 and 5 of T1N-R3E, M.D.B.&M. and Sections 33 and 32, T2N-R3E, M.D.B.&M., thence North 20 feet, thence East 120 chains, thence South 40 feet, thence West 120 chains, thence North 20 feet to the point of beginning.

PARCEL 2.

A forty foot wide strip of land being a portion of a county road known as Byron Highway, described as follows:

Commencing at the corner common to Sections 3 and 4, TIN-R3E, M.D.B.&M. and Section 33 and 34, T2N-R3E, M.D.B. &M, thence West 20 feet, thence South 80 chains to a point on the south line of Section 4, TIN-R3RE, thence East 40 feet, thence North 80 chains to a point of the North line of Section 3, TIN-R3E, thence West 20 feet to the point of beginning.

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
