## **GENERAL LEASE - PROTECTIVE STRUCTURE USE**

#### **APPLICANT:**

Cargill, Inc. 7220 Central Avenue Newark, California 94560

#### AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

Three parcels of tide and submerged land totaling 0.777 acre, located in San Francisco Bay, Mud Slough and Coyote Creek, Alameda County.

#### LAND USE:

Use and maintenance of three existing dredge locks for the ingress and egress of the Cargill Salt dredge to maintain the levees around the perimeter of the adjacent salt evaporator ponds.

### **PROPOSED LEASE TERMS:**

Lease period:

Twenty years beginning November 1, 1995.

Surety bond: \$5,000.

Public liability insurance: Combined single limit coverage of \$1,000,000.

#### **CONSIDERATION:**

\$350.00 per annum; with the State reserving the right to fix a different rental on each fifth anniversary of the lease.

Applicant is permittee of upland.

#### OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. The proposed project involves the use and maintenance of three existing dredge locks located along Cargill's bay front and internal levees adjacent to salt evaporation ponds in San Francisco Bay, Mud Slough and Coyote Creek. These locks are used approximately once every four or five years for the ingress and egress of the Cargill Salt dredge when it is necessary to maintain the levees to confine the salt brine in the salt evaporation ponds.
- 2. On March 14, 1995, the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC) granted permit #4-93 for this project under its certified regulatory program (14 Cal. Code Regs. 15251(h)).
- 3. Staff has reviewed the document and determined that the conditions, as specified in 14 Cal. Code Regs. 15253(b) have been met for the Commission to use the environmental analysis document certified by the BCDC as a Negative Declaration substitute in order to comply with the requirements of CEQA.

4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
