DREDGING LEASE

APPLICANT:

San Diego Unified Port District P.O. Box 488 San Diego, California 92112-0488

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

Granted lands, with minerals reserved, at the Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal in San Diego Bay, San Diego County.

LAND USE:

Dredge a maximum 14,500 cubic yards of material from mineral reservation lands in San Diego Bay in conjunction with the deepening of Berths 10-7 and 10-8 for servicing larger ships at the Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal, San Diego Bay. Material will be temporarily stockpiled on granted sovereign land with ultimate deposition at an approved upland landfill.

PROPOSED LEASE TERMS:

Lease period:

January 1, 1996 through December 31, 1998.

Royalty:

No royalty shall be charged for dredged material as the project is a public benefit. A minimum of \$0.25 per cubic yard shall be charged for material used for private benefit or commercial sale purposes.

PREREQUISITE CONDITIONS, FEES AND EXPENSES:

Filing and processing fees have been received.

1. FIND THAT A NEGATIVE DECLARATION WAS PREPARED AND ADOPTED FOR THIS PROJECT BY THE SAN DIEGO UNIFIED PORT DISTRICT AND THAT THE COMMISSION HAS REVIEWED AND CONSIDERED THE

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INFORMATION CONTAINED THEREIN.

- 2. FIND THAT THIS ACTIVITY IS CONSISTENT WITH THE USE CLASSIFICATION DESIGNATED FOR THE LAND PURSUANT TO PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE SECTIONS 6370, ET SEQ.
- 3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO THE SAN DIEGO UNIFIED PORT DISTRICT OF A THREE-YEAR DREDGING LEASE BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1996 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 1998. SAID LEASE SHALL ALLOW DREDGING A MAXIMUM VOLUME OF 14,500 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL FROM GRANTED LANDS, WITH MINERALS RESERVED, AT THE TENTH AVENUE MARINE TERMINAL, SAN DIEGO BAY, SAN DIEGO COUNTY. MATERIAL WILL BE TEMPORARILY STOCKPILED AT AN EXISTING FACILITY ON GRANTED SOVEREIGN LANDS WITH ULTIMATE DEPOSITION AT AN APPROVED UPLAND LANDFILL. SUCH PERMITTED ACTIVITY IS CONTINGENT UPON APPLICANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PERMITS, RECOMMENDATIONS, OR LIMITATIONS ISSUED BY FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.

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
