# AMEND GENERAL LEASE - INDUSTRIAL USE NO. WP 5026.1 TERMINATE GENERAL LEASE - INDUSTRIAL USE NO. PRC 7066.1 ISSUANCE OF LETTER AGREEMENT W 25378

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

California \& Hawaiian Sugar Company, Inc. (C\&H) operates a sugar refinery in the city of Crockett in Contra Costa County. Portions of the refinery operation occupy filled and unfilled State owned sovereign lands in the Carquinez Strait, as authorized by Commission Lease Nos. PRC 5026.1 and PRC 7066.1. These leases authorize the use of the State owned lands for a wastewater treatment facility and related structures, liquid sugar tanks, a truck washing station, storage of trailers used for transporting dry sugar shipments, a water pipeline, and two power conduits.

Commission staff and C\&H propose to consolidate these two leases by amending Lease No. PRC 5026.1 to include the land previously leased to C\&H under Lease No. PRC 7066.1, and to correct errors in the land description of the leased premises.

In addition, C\&H proposes to delete a portion of the current leased premises which they do not need for their operations, so that the these lands may be used by the Carquinez Regional Environmental Education Center (CREEC) for storage and maintenance of containerized native trees and plants in conjunction with environmental restoration and enhancement projects along the Strait.

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## CALENDAR ITEM NO. C61 (CONT'D)

PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF LEASE NO. PRC 5026.1:

1. The land description will be amended to include lands previously leased under Lease No. PRC 7066.1, to correct errors in the previous land description, and to delete lands to be used by CREEC in conjunction with its environmental restoration and enhancement projects along the Carquinez Strait. The amended land description is attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein as Exhibit A.
2. The consideration will be $\$ 78,369$ per year, with the State reserving the right to fix a different rental periodically during the term of the lease, as provided in the lease. (The current annual rent for Lease Nos. PRC 5026.1 and PRC 7066.1 is $\$ 44,910$ per year.)
3. Lessee will provide liability insurance for combined single limit coverage of \$5,000,000.
4. All other terms and conditions of Lease No. PRC 5026.1 shall remain in effect without amendment.

## PROPOSED TERMINATION OF LEASE NO. PRC 7066.1:

Upon consolidation of Lease No. PRC 7066.1 into Lease No. PRC 5026.1, Lease No. PRC 7066.1 will be terminated.

## PROPOSED LETTER AGREEMENT:

After deletion of the lands described in Exhibit C attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein from Lease No. PRC 5026.1, a Letter Agreement will be issued to the Carquinez Regional Environmental Education Center; authorizing the use of the lands in conjunction with environmental restoration and enhancement projects along the Carquinez Strait.

The Letter Agreement will have a term of ten years beginning April 1, 1997, and will require liability insurance with coverage of no less than $\$ 500,000$.

## OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA, as follows:

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## CALENDAR ITEM NO. C61 (CONT'D)

As to the consolidation of Lease Nos. PRC 5026.1 and PRC 7066.1, and the deleting specified land from Lease No. PRC 5026.1, the activity is exempt because it not a "project" as defined by the CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.
Authority: Public Resources Code section 21065 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15378.

As to the correction of the land description for Lease No. PRC 5026.1, the activity is exempt because it involves an "ongoing project" as defined by CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.
Authority: Public Resources Code section 21169 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15261.

As to the Letter Agreement, the activity is exempt under the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. The staff believes, based on the information to it, that there is no possibility that this project may have a significant effect on the environment.
