### **GENERAL LEASE - PUBLIC AGENCY USE**

### **APPLICANT:**

State of California Department of Parks and Recreation P. O. Box 942896 Sacramento, California 95825

### AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

727 acres, more or less, of sovereign lands in the Pacific Ocean, adjacent to Refugio State Beach, Santa Barbara County.

### AUTHORIZED USE:

Management of an underwater recreation area.

### LEASE TERM:

20 years, beginning February 1, 1998.

### CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit; with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rent if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

### **OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:**

- 1. Applicant owns the uplands adjoining the lease premises.
- 2. The proposed underwater recreation area will be managed by the Department of Parks and Recreation (Parks) and will provide for the preservation, through management by Parks, of the natural underwater resources that provides a public benefit which includes underwater recreation. The proposed underwater recreation area includes kelp beds and shallow reefs that offer the public outstanding diving opportunities.

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- 3. The Advisory Board on Underwater Parks and Reserves approved the proposed underwater recreation area on October 19, 1991. The inclusion of the sovereign lands as part of the underwater recreation area will allow Parks to allocate funding to develop the required <u>onshore</u> facilities to support the proposed underwater recreation area. The proposed <u>onshore</u> facilities include the construction of wash down stations, outdoor showers and gear drop-off areas. Parks does not intend to construct any structures within the proposed underwater recreation area.
- 4. Commission records indicate there is one existing oil and gas lease that extends into the proposed recreation area. The lease involved is Lease No. PRC 2991.1, and is issued to Union Oil Company of California. The Lessee has been advised of the planned underwater recreation area activity and has provided a letter of no objection to the proposed activity.
- 5. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 16, Transfer of Ownership of Land in Order to Create Parks; Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 2905 (g).

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15300 and Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 2905.

6. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

#### LAND DESCRIPTION

A parcel of tide and submerged land in the Pacific Ocean adjacent to Refugio State Beach in the County of Santa Barbara, State of California, described as follows:

Bounded on the North by the Ordinary High Water Mark of the Pacific Ocean and on the West, South and East by the following described line:
