CONSIDER ACCEPTANCE OF THE FULL QUITCLAIM DEED OF OIL AND GAS LEASE NO. PRC 2206.1 (3,840 ACRES OF TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS), OFFSHORE SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

LESSEE:

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2206.1 contains 3,840 acres of tide and submerged lands offshore Santa Barbara County, California.

BACKGROUND:

Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2206.1 (Lease) was issued to The Texas Company, Monterey Oil Company and Newmont Oil Company on July 25, 1958. Through a series of name changes and assignments, Texaco Exploration and Production, Inc., is the 100 percent holder and operator of Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2206.1. Under the terms of the Lease, the lessee is required to pay an annual rental of \$1.00 per acre (\$3,840 for 3,840 acres). Wells have been drilled on or into the leased lands from Platform Helen. All wells from Platform Helen were abandoned and the platform removed in 1988.

Public Resources Code section 6804.1 and Lease paragraph 5 permit the lessee to make at any time a written quitclaim of all rights under the lease or of any portion of the leased lands comprising a ten-acre parcel or multiple thereof in a compact form. The quitclaim will be effective when it is filed and accepted by the State subject to the continued obligation of the lessee and its surety to pay all

accrued rentals and royalties and to cure all defaults under the lease. On August 25, 1999, the Commission's Long Beach office staff received the document "(Full) Quitclaim Deed for State Oil and Gas Lease." This document was dated August 16, 1999, and quitclaims back to the State all of the lessee's right, title and interest in the leased lands described in Exhibit A of Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2206.1 dated July 25, 1958.

A review of the Commission's files reveals that no default exists on the Lease, that the lessee has complied with all applicable laws and Lease provisions and has paid all rentals and royalty.


