#### **TERMINATION OF LEASE**

#### LESSEE:

Pacific Properties 101 W. Ash Street San Diego, California 92101

#### AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

260 acres, more or less, of sovereign lands in the Pacific Ocean, near Point Conception, Santa Barbara County.

#### **AUTHORIZED USE:**

Construction, operation and maintenance of a marine terminal for the purpose of receiving, storing and the regassification of liquified natural gas.

#### LEASE TERM:

30 years, beginning January 1, 1979, including a renewal option of two successive periods each; one period of ten years and one period of nine years.

#### **CONSIDERATION:**

\$10,000 per year.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

On November 27, 1978, the California State Lands Commission (CSLC) approved the issuance of a General Lease – Industrial Use (Lease No. PRC 5582.1) to Western LNG Terminal Associates (a general partnership composed of subsidiaries of Pacific Lighting Corp., and Pacific Gas and Electric Company). On December 4, 1986, Western LNG Terminal Associates provided notice to the CSLC of their name change to Pacific Properties.

Lease No. PRC 5582.1 authorized the construction, operation and maintenance of a liquefied natural gas (LNG) receiving, storage and regassification terminal. The marine terminal was proposed to be used to import LNG from Indonesia and South Alaska in accordance with the Liquefied Natural Gas Act of 1977 (Public

Utilities Code Section 5551, et seq.) Section 5559 of the Act provided in part that if a lease of State land were required for the LNG marine terminal, then the CSLC would issue a lease. While the proposed LNG project did receive permits, it was never constructed. Further, in 1987, the Public Utilities Commission was provided with notice that the LNG marine terminal would not be built.

On November 18, 1999, Pacific Properties sold the uplands that adjoin the lease premises to another party. On July 14, 2000, Pacific Properties provided a written notice to CSLC staff of their intent to terminate their interest in Lease No. PRC 5582.1.

#### OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA because the activity is not a "project" as defined by the CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.


