GENERAL LEASE - PUBLIC AGENCY USE

LESSEE:

San Francisco State University Romberg Tiburon Center for Environmental Studies 3150 Paradise Drive Tiburon, California 94920

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign lands in the San Francisco Bay, near the city of Tiburon, Marin County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Construction, use, and maintenance of a 300 foot long, 8-inch diameter saltwater intake pipeline, and drainage rock and rip-rap appurtenant thereto.

LEASE TERM:

Fifteen years, beginning January 1, 2001.

CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit; with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rent if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. Applicant owns the uplands adjoining the lease premises. The main purpose of this pipeline is to provide bay water for biological and oceanographic research at the Romberg Tiburon Center. In addition, the Tiburon Fire Department will tap into the pipeline on the upland and divert water for fire fighting purposes.
- 2. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the

staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA under the general rule that the CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. The staff believes, based on the information available to it, that there is no possibility that this project may have a significant effect on the environment.

Authority: Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061 (b)(3).

3. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
