REQUEST DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY FOR EXECUTIVE OFFICER
TO SOLICIT PROPOSALS, NEGOTIATE FAIR AND REASONABLE PRICE, AWARD
AND EXECUTE AGREEMENT FOR PREPARATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL
DOCUMENTATION REGARDING THE RESTORATION OF THE EXISTING TIDAL
INLET STRUCTURE AT THE MOUTH OF THE LAGOON IN CARLSBAD,

BACKGROUND:

The Northern Inlet Jetty Restoration Project at Agua Hedionda Lagoon is being proposed by Cabrillo Power, LLC to address sedimentation/shoaling impacts within the outer portion of the Lagoon.

Since 1954, the management strategy at Agua Hedionda has consisted of frequent and regular maintenance dredging events to ensure adequate tidal flow for overall Lagoon health. Today, the Lagoon is a prominent community resource and asset. The Lagoon currently supports numerous land uses and activities including: Cabrillo Power's Encina Generating Station (Station); the Hubbs-Seaworld Research Institute; an aquaculture farming and research venture; a YMCA camp for children; commercial water sports entities; a residential boat harbor; private residences; and many other uses including, kayaking, fishing, water skiing, and boating.

Based on current data and future projections, the current frequency of dredging may be inadequate in consideration of potential increased Lagoon sedimentation associated with the SANDAG Regional Beach Sand Project, sand by passing requirements, and longer-term regional beach nourishment strategies. A supplemental long-term engineering approach is being proposed to reduce the frequency of maintenance dredging while maintaining the appropriate level of tidal circulation within the Lagoon.

CALENDAR ITEM NO. C91 (CONT'D)

PROPOSED ACTIVITY:

The proposed Project would restore the northern arm of the existing tidal inlet structure (consisting of two jetties) at the mouth of the Lagoon in Carlsbad, California. When initially constructed in 1954, both inlet jetties were longer. The Proposed Project would restore approximately 200 linear feet of the northern inlet jetty. The restored portion of the north jetty would match the original historical footprint of the north jetty and would be visually compatible with the existing south jetty, being constructed in the same manner and of similar materials. Project construction would occur over a period of approximately three months during the off-season winter months.

Consultant selection shall be conducted consistent with procedures as specified in CSLC Regulations and in the State Contracting Manual on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications for the types of services to be performed and at a fair and reasonable price. All costs shall be recovered from project applicant.
