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RECREATIONAL PIER LEASE

APPLICANTS:

Jeffrey A. Yurosek and Debra Janine Yurosek

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign lands in Lake Tahoe, located near Tahoe City, Placer County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Retention, use and maintenance of two existing mooring buoys.

LEASE TERM:

Ten years, beginning September 1, 2002.

CONSIDERATION:

No monetary consideration pursuant to Public Resources Code section 6503.5.

SPECIFIC LEASE PROVISIONS:

Insurance:

Liability insurance in the amount of no less than \$300,000.

Other:

The lease is conditioned on the Applicants obtaining authorization from the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA) for the mooring buoy within two years after the adoption of the Lake Tahoe Shorezone Amendments-Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and approval of the ordinances based on the EIS.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. The Applicants have submitted an application to the Commission for the retention of two existing mooring buoys, which were placed in Lake Tahoe before the Applicants purchased the upland property.

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- 2. Applicants qualify for a Recreational Pier Lease because they are natural persons who have improved the littoral lands with, and use the uplands for, a single-family dwelling.
- Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 3, New Construction of Small Structures; Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 2905 (c)(3).

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15300 and Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 2905.

4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
