TERMINATION OF RECREATIONAL PIER LEASE AND ISSUANCE OF NEW RECREATIONAL PIER LEASE

APPLICANT/LESSEE:

Carolyn Sue Griset, as Trustee of the Carolyn Sue Griset Family Trust dated August 15, 1989.

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign lands in Lake Tahoe, Tahoe Vista, Placer County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

The removal, relocation and reconstruction of an existing pier previously authorized by the Commission, installation of a new boat lift and retention of two existing mooring buoys as shown on the attached Exhibit A.

LEASE TERM:

Ten years, beginning August 1, 2003.

CONSIDERATION:

No monetary consideration pursuant to Public Resources Code section 6503.5.

SPECIFIC LEASE PROVISIONS:

Insurance:

Liability insurance with coverage of no less than \$300,000.

Other:

This lease is conditioned on Applicant's obtaining authorization from the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA) for the mooring buoys within two years after the adoption of the Lake Tahoe Shorezone Amendments-Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and approval of the ordinances based on the EIS.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. On October 28, 1996, the Commission authorized a Recreational Pier Lease to Lessee for an existing pier. That lease will expire on

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December 11, 2004. Applicant submitted an application for the pier removal, relocation and reconstruction, installation of a new boat lift and retention two existing mooring buoys. Applicant is now applying for a new Recreational Pier Lease.

- 2. The Tahoe Yellow Cress (TYC) is listed under the provisions of the California Endangered Species Act as an endangered plant species subject to special protection. On October 1, 2002, the Commission authorized the Executive Officer on their behalf to sign a Memorandum of Understanding to implement the "Conservation Strategy For Tahoe Yellow Cress (Rorippa subumbellata) in conjunction with the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the U.S. Forest Service, the Nevada Division of Forestry, the Nevada Division of State Lands, the Nevada Division of State Parks, the Nevada Natural Heritage Program, the California Department of Fish and Game, the California Department of Parks and Recreation, the California Tahoe Conservancy, the Tahoe Lakefront Owners' Association and the League To Save Lake Tahoe.
- 3. The proposed project is located in suitable TYC habitat. The project site was surveyed for the presence of TYC by staff of the Commission on July 15, 2003, and the project site does not presently contain TYC.
- 4. **Termination of Existing Lease:** Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines [Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15060(c)(3)], the staff has determined that this activity is not subject to the provisions of the CEQA because it is not a "project" as defined by the CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21065 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, sections 15060 (c)(3) and 15378.

5. **Issuance of New Lease:** Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA under the general rule that the CEQA applies only to

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projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. The staff believes, based on the information available to it, that there is no possibility that this project may have a significant effect on the environment.

Authority: Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061 (b)(3).

6. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.


