DREDGING LEASE

APPLICANT:

Chevron Products Company 940 Henseley Street Richmond, California 94802

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Approximately 20 acres of sovereign lands in Castro Cove within San Pablo Bay, Contra Costa County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Dredge a maximum of 100,000 cubic yards of material for the purpose of soil remediation. Dredged material will be disposed at the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board's designated upland disposal site, the No. 1 Oxidation Pond within the Chevron Refinery.

LEASE TERM:

Two years, beginning December 15, 2006

CONSIDERATION:

No monetary consideration will be charged as the project will result in a public benefit. The dredged material will not be sold.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Castro Cove was listed as a candidate toxic hot spot under the Bay Protection and Toxic Cleanup Program in 1998. Ecological risk assessments determined that two chemicals – PAHs and mercury – pose a potential risk to sediment-dwelling organisms. The dredging and disposal is part of the Castro Cove Remediation project to be performed under a Site Cleanup Order from the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board.

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- 2. Sediment removal is to take place within a sealed sheetpile enclosure that would be in place for approximately nine months. The uppermost two and one-half feet of sediment will be removed from the area, with the exception of an approximately one and onehalf acre area that is to have three feet of sediment removed and will be subsequently capped.
- 3. The Dredging Lease area is a portion of a Commission authorized Industrial Lease (PRC 4117.1), which includes Chevron facilities associated with its Richmond Refinery.
- 4. A Mitigated Negative Declaration was prepared and adopted for this project by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board San Francisco Bay Region. The California State Lands Commission's staff has reviewed such document. A Mitigation Monitoring Program was adopted by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board San Francisco Bay Region.
- 5. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

DREDGED MATERIALS WILL BE DISPOSED AT THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD'S DESIGNATED UPLAND DISPOSAL SITE, THE NO. 1 OXIDATION POND WITHIN THE CHEVRON REFINERY. SUCH PERMITTED ACITIVITY IS CONTINGENT UPON APPLICANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PERMITS. RECOMMENDATIONS, OR LIMITATIONS ISSUED BY FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS. NO MONETARY CONSIDERATION WILL BE CHARGED AS THE PROJECT WILL RESULT IN A PUBLIC BENEFIT. THE DREDGED MATERIAL WILL NOT BE SOLD.

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
