## TERMINATION OF A GENERAL LEASE – RECREATIONAL USE AND ISSUANCE OF A RECREATIONAL PIER LEASE

### LESSEE:

Wiedemann Ranch, Inc.

### APPLICANTS:

John Stannard and Cathy Stannard

### AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign land in Lake Tahoe, adjacent to 3795 Belleview Avenue, near Homewood, Placer County.

#### **AUTHORIZED USE:**

Continued use and maintenance of two existing mooring buoys as shown on the attached Exhibit A.

#### LEASE TERM:

10 years, beginning April 15, 2010.

### **CONSIDERATION:**

No monetary consideration pursuant to Public Resources Code section 6503.5.

### SPECIFIC LEASE PROVISIONS:

Insurance:

Liability insurance in the amount of no less than \$500,000.

### Other:

The proposed lease contains a provision requiring the Applicants to obtain authorization from the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA) for the mooring buoys within two years after the adoption of a Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) for the Lake Tahoe Shorezone Ordinance Amendments and approval of the amended ordinances. This is a continuation of the process the Commission used from approximately 1995 to October 2008 when TRPA adopted an FEIS and Ordinance

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Amendments supported by the FEIS. In September 2010, the U.S. District Court invalidated the FEIS and nullified the Amendments. TRPA is presently evaluating its response. At such time as additional information is available, Commission staff will advise the Commission on any suggested modifications to the process used by the Commission pending resolution of the TRPA FEIS and amended ordinance issues.

### OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. Applicants own the uplands adjoining the lease premises.
- 2. On June 28, 2007, the Commission authorized a General Lease Recreational Use with Wiedemann Ranch, Inc. That lease will expire on August 26, 2017. On April 15, 2010, the ownership of the upland parcel was deeded to John Stannard and Cathy Stannard. Applicants are now applying for a new Recreational Pier Lease.
- The Applicants qualify for a Recreational Pier Lease because they are natural persons who own the littoral land that is improved with a singlefamily dwelling.
- 4. **Termination of Existing Lease:** Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines [Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15060(c)(3)], staff has determined this activity is not subject to the provisions of CEQA because it is not a "project" as defined by CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21065 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, sections 15060 (c)(3) and 15378.

5. **Issuance of New Lease:** Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), staff has determined this activity is exempt from the requirements of CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 1, Existing Facilities; Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 2905 (a)(2).

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15300 and Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 2905.

6. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating

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such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.




### SIGNIFICANT LANDS INVENTORY FINDING:

Find that this activity is consistent with the use classification designated by the Commission for the land pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq.

### **AUTHORIZATION:**

- 1. Authorize termination, effective April 14, 2010, of Lease No. PRC 6925.1, a General Lease Recreational Use, issued to Wiedemann Ranch, Inc., and authorized by the Commission on June 28, 2007.
- Authorize issuance of a 10-year Recreational Pier Lease to John Stannard and Cathy Stannard, beginning April 15, 2010, for the continued use and maintenance of two existing mooring buoys as shown on Exhibit A attached and by this reference made a part hereof; no monetary consideration pursuant to Public Resources Code section 6503.5; and liability insurance in the amount of no less than \$500,000.
