- **WHEREAS**, organizations such as Save The Bay are essential for the protection, promotion, and enhancement of public trust resources, such as the Bay, for the benefit of current and future generations; and
- **WHEREAS**, this year, Save The Bay celebrates its 50th Anniversary and five decades of achievements and accomplishments in protecting and preserving the environmental integrity of the San Francisco Bay; now, therefore, be it
