# CONTINUATION OF RENT

#### LESSEE:

Venoco, Inc.

#### AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

0.09 acre, more or less, of sovereign land in Roaring River Slough and Grizzly Slough, at Van Sickle Island, Solano County.

#### AUTHORIZED USE:

Continued use and maintenance of one existing two-inch diameter steel water/condensate pipeline and one existing six-inch diameter steel natural gas pipeline as shown on Exhibit A.

#### LEASE TERM:

20 years, beginning August 1, 2004.

#### **CONSIDERATION:**

This lease provides that Lessor may modify the rent periodically during the lease term. Pursuant to this provision, staff conducted a review of the rent under this lease, and recommends rent be continued at \$200 per year, effective August 1, 2012.

#### **OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:**

- 1. On June 26, 2006, the Commission authorized a General Lease Right of Way Use to Venoco, Inc. for the continued use and maintenance of one existing two-inch diameter steel water/condensate pipeline and one existing six-inch diameter steel natural gas pipeline. The lease will expire July 31, 2024.
- 2. Both pipelines are part of a gas gathering system that takes produced gas from certain gas wells on Van Sickle Island to a Pacific Gas and Electric Company sales master meter located on other upland properties. The sixinch natural gas pipeline is a rural "gathering line" and is not regulated under the Code of Federal Regulations (49 CFR 192.1). However, the

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Van Sickle Gas Field is regulated by the California Department of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources (DOGGR). The Lessee conducted a hydrostatic presure test on February 17, 2005. The test confirmed the internal integrity of the pipeline. No incidents or spills have occurred during the Lessee's ownership of the pipelines.
