## CONSIDER SPONSORING STATE LEGISLATION TO AMEND THE CITY OF PITTSBURG GRANTING STATUTE TO ADD A LEGAL LAND DESCRIPTION AND DELETE A REQUIREMENT THAT THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION SURVEY AND RECORD A LAND DESCRIPTION OF THE TRUST LANDS IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY RECORDER

## SUMMARY:

This proposed legislation would amend the City of Pittsburg (City) granting statute to add a legal description of the City's granted lands and delete a requirement that the State Lands Commission (Commission) survey and record a plat and legal description of the trust lands in the office of the Contra Costa County Recorder.

## EXISTING LAW:

SB 551 (DeSaulnier), Chapter 422, statutes of 2011 repealed a grant of public trust land made in 2006 by the state to the City and enacted a new grant of public trust land that includes land in the 2006 grant plus land annexed to the City in 2009. Section 10(a) of Chapter 422 requires the Commission to survey, monument, and record a plat and a metes and bounds description of the public trust lands legislatively granted to the City in the office of the Contra Costa County Recorder.

## BACKGROUND:

Commission staff has completed the record of survey and land description that depict and describe the location and extent of the sovereign tide and submerged lands granted to the City. Both documents were approved by the Commission at its meeting on October 14, 2014 (Calendar Item C100).

The record of survey was recorded with the Contra Costa County Recorder's Office on December 11, 2014, as required by Chapter 422. The legal description, however, cannot be recorded because the County Recorder determined that a metes and bounds description, on its own, is not a recordable instrument, as opposed to a grant deed or quitclaim deed. Without the ability to record the legal description of the City's granted lands, the Commission cannot comply with existing law.

An act to amend Section 2 of, and to repeal Sections 9 and 10 of, Chapter 422 of the Statutes of 2011, relating to tidelands.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of Chapter 422 of the Statutes of 2011 is amended to read:

Sec. 2. (a) For the purposes of this act, the following definitions shall apply:
(1) "Act" means Sections 2 to $1 \theta, 8$, inclusive, of the aet enating this section.

## Chapter 422 of the Statutes of 2011 , as amended from time to time.

(2) "Commission" means the State Lands Commission.
(3) "Public trust doctrine" means the common law doctrine, as enunciated by the court in National Audubon Society v. Superior Court (1983) 33 Cal.3d 419, and other relevant judicial decisions, specifying the state's authority as sovereign to exercise a continuous supervision and control over the navigable waters of the state, the lands underlying those waters, and nonnavigable tributaries to navigable waters, including the maritime or water dependent commerce, navigation, and fisheries, and the preservation of lands in their natural state for scientific study, open space, wildlife habitat, and water-oriented recreation.
(4) "State" means the State of California.
(5) "Trustee" means the City of Pittsburg, a municipal corporation.
(6) "Trust lands" means all tidelands and submerged lands, whether filled or unfilled, situated within the boundaries of the City of Pittsburg including those lands annexed to the City of Pittsburg pursuant to Section 56740 of the Government Code on December 31, 2009, as-surveyed, monmented, and recorded pursuant to Seetion 100f this aet, exeept provided in Section-9 of this aet. described in subdivision (b).
(7) "Trust revenues" means all revenues received from trust lands and trust assets.
(8) "Trust lands use plan" or "plan" means the trust use land plan required to be submitted by the trustee to the commission pursuant to Section 4 of this act.
(9) "Trust lands use report" means the trust lands use report of its utilization of the trust lands required to be submitted by the trustee pursuant to Section 5 of this act.
(b) There is hereby granted in trust to the City of Pittsburg, and to its successors, all of the rights, title, and interest of the state, held by the state by virtue of its sovereignty in and to all tide and submerged lands, whether filled or unfilled, situated in the City of Pittsburg, County of Contra Costa, including those lands annexed to the City of Pittsburg pursuant to Section 56740 of the Government Code on December 31, 2009, as suryed, montmented, and reeorded purstant to section 10 of this aet, exeept as provided in Section-9 of this act follows:

A parcel of tide and submerged lands lying in the bed of Suisun Bay, Mallard Slough, New York Slough, and Middle Slough, adjacent to Rancho Los Medanos as shown on official government plat approved October 27, 1869, County of Contra Costa, State of California, described as follows:

## LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

General Suibject: State tidelands transfer: City of Pittsburg.

Existing law provides for a grant of specified tidelands and submerged lands from the state to the City of Pittsburg, subject to specified conditions, and requires that the trust lands be held by the City of Pittsburg as trustee, for the benefit of all people of the state for purposes consistent with the public trust doctrine, including the protection of maritime or water dependent commerce, navigation, and fisheries, and the preservation of the lands in their natural state for scientific study, open space, wildlife habitat, and water-oriented recreation. Existing law required the State Lands Commission, by January 1, 2014, to survey, monument, and record a plat and a metes and bounds description of the trust lands subject to the grant.

This will would amend those provisions to include that above-described metes and bounds description of the trust lands subject to the grant and would repeal the obsolete provisions requiring the commission to complete that survey.
