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CHAIRMAN CRANSTON: The meeting will please come to order.

We have one calender item I believe, "Request for approval of Contract for Sale of Natural Gas, City of Long Beach, Wilmington Oil Field - W. O. 10,139." The recommendation from the staff is that we approve the contract. Frank, do you have any comments?

MR. HORTIG: In refreshing the memory of the Commissioners, Mr. Chairman, I might point out that on December 22 the Commission approved the specifications and forms for the purpose of inviting bids in connection with the matter under consideration today and this approval of specifications was also pursuant to approval as to legal form by the Office of the Attorney General. Pursuant to the advertising the City of Long Beach lid receive one bid from the present gas processing operator who has operated the system for approximately the last 20 years. The expectation, as nearly as an economic evaluation can be made, now is that the net return under the new contract will not be less than the net return that would have been expected under the two contracts which will be superceded, and as a result of the prior approval by the Attorney General of the form it was indicated that no further legal clearance was necessary in the event that the approved form was used for the bid

invitation. Such was done, and, therefore, it is recommended that the Commission authorize the Executive Officer to advise the City of Long Beach that it approves the contract for the sale of natural gas produced and saved from, or allocated to, the designated parcels in the Wilmington Oil Field, which are involved in the contract between the Board of Harbor Commissioners of the City of Long Beach and Lomita-Signal-Wilmington Associates on January 23, 1961, and who, parenthetically, represent the parcels of land operated for the City of Long Beach under a service contract by the Long Beach Oil Development Company.

MR. CARR: I so move.

MR. ANDERSON: Seconded,

CHAIRMAN CRANSFON: It's been moved, seconded, and unanimously adopted.

Frank, do you have other matters?

MR. HORTIG: No, sir.
