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

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3	CHAIRMAN CORY: Okay. Call the meeting to order.
4	Everybody is here, and we're ready to go.
5	Confirmation of the previous minutes. Any
6	corrections or additions?
7	Without objection, it will be approved as presented.
8	Report of the Executive Officer. Let's make it
9	quick.
10	EXECUTIVE OFFICER NORTHROP: Mr. Chairman and
11	Members, on March 17th, 1977, you as District Judge
12	William Gray issued a ruling which precluded the State
13	from realizing the gravity differential adjustment allowed
14	by FEA on lower tier oil and required the refund of monies
15	already collected under protest.
16	We are advised by not only the Attorney General,
17	but the Long Beach City Attorney, that the crude oil
18	evaluation provisions of the Long Beach Unit are substantially
19	the same as those of LBOD and Parcel "A". In light of the
20	above decision and advice by counsel, we have decided not
21	to continue attempts to press for collection of the gravity
22	differential on the latter two contracts.
23	The Assembly Ways and Means Committee has
24	recommended the State Lands Commission budget be augmented
25	by \$500,000 for the purpose of removing hazardous

obstructions from State's navigable waterways largely 2 because of the good work we did in the area of the 3 Sacramento River. They feel that because of the lower 4 water situation, the time is right to remove many of these 5 hazards that represent serious threats to the public safety. 6 As landlord, the State Lands Commission has tort liability. 7 The Staff is currently putting together an inventory of 8 these hazards and attempting to rank them according to 9 priority for removal. We will, therefore, be ready to 10 proceed with an active program once these monies have been 19 allocated. 12 This concludes my report, Mr. Chairman. 13 CHAIRMAN CORY: Any questions? 14 Okay. Report of the Assistant Executive Officer.

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MR. GOLDEN: I will give a brief summary of
April's actions of the Bay Conservation and Development
Commission and the Coastal Commission affecting matters
under State Lands' jurisdiction.

19 At the Bay Conservation and Development Commission
20 meeting of April 21, consideration was given to a stipulated
21 judgment entered against F. E. Crites, Inc., in favor of
22 Bay Conservation Development Commission, Regional Water
23 Quality Control Boarl and State Lands Commission.

24 The suit was entered into by our Commission25 because of illegal sand dredging on State-owned lands. The

such other arrangements as the three parties should agree
upon. It was recognized that the monetary sum, if imposed,
would probably institute a bankruptcy action; but if an
alternative could be found which would all Mr. Crites to
continue in business legitimately, all parties concerned
might benefit.

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Part of the proposal would be the conveyance of 8 9 89 acres of marsh to the State Lands Commission, which it 10 is proposed would be turned over to the Department of Fish 11 and Game for management. During the hearing it became 12 apparent that the Crites interests were not satisfied with 13 the negotiated settlement, and therefore, attempted to 14 have the Bay Conservation Commission make concessions. This 15 effort was firmly rejected.

16 The State Coastal Commission approved the maps 17 delineating the jurisdiction of each of the port areas 18 set forth in the Coastal Act. A. our request, in so doing 19 they made the approval dependent upon our review and 20 concurrence. In this way, later conflict would be adverted; 21 and at the April 20th meeting of the Coastal Commission, 22 the application of the port San Luis District to upgrade 23 the harbor by providing 410 boat slips, 500 more in-shore 24 facilities, floating fuel dock, pumpout station was 25 considered. Landfill of seven acres was also involved.

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1 This application was rejected overwhelmingly on the basis that it was growth-inducing and that it might 2 3 interfere with the development of the local coastal program. The Commission members were sympathetic to a smaller-scale 5 project, but the project sponsors pointed out that a smaller 6 project would not be able to be financed. They were 7 depending upon a Department of Navigation and Ocean 8 Development loan to be matched by the Corps of Engineers 9 on a 45 to 55 ratic. 10 That concludes my report, Mr. Chairman. 11 CHAIRMAN CORY: We have a report here from the Executive Office signed by you, dated the 27th on the 12 Wildlife Conservation Board. 13 14 EXECUTIVE OFFICER NORTHROP: Yes. This is in response to Mr. McCausland's request at the last meeting, 15 and we submitted it in writing rather than giving it in 16 17 a report form. 18 CHAIRMAN CORY: Is that sufficient? 19 MR. McCAUSLAND: I found it adequate, Mr. Chairman. 20 CHAIRMAN CORY: Next we have the Consent Calendar. 21 Is there anyone in the audience who would like to address 22 the Commission? Do you have any problems with any of the 23 items on the Consent Calendar which are designated with 24 the letter C through 30? 25 Okay. There is one item the Chairman would like

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1 not to participate in the decision on, which is --2 EXECUTIVE OFFICER NORTHROP: C4, Mr. Chairman. CHAIRMAN CORY: C4. This is item "Bay Cities Refuse 3. Service". I'm not sure who that is. It's just that I 4 5 may have business relations with the individual. 6 Other than that, are there any other items? 7 I guess we have a motion for all items Okay, excluding 4. Those will be approved without objection as 8 presented. 9 10 Item C4, what is your wish? 17 MR. McCAUSLAND: I'll move adoption. MS. SMITH: I will abstain. 12 MR. McCAUSLAND: Mr. Chairman, I'd like to suggest 13 we put Item C4 over for another month or two --14 CHAIRMAN CORY: Okay. We'll put it over. 15 MR, McCAUSLAND: It may be that we won't be able 16 17 to allow you to waive your --18 CHAIRMAN CORY: That may be where we are. 19 EXECUTIVE OFFICER NORTHROP: The Staff notes that C4 is over. 20 CHAIRMAN CORY: C4 is over. 21 MR. McCAUSLAND: I have requested that Item 31 22 be dealt with separately because I wanted to make certain 23 we could ascertain that the provisions of the State Contract 24 25 Act have been met prior to the extension of --

1 EXECUTIVE OFFICER NORTHROP: Mr. McCausland, the 2 Staff advises that the original contract -- Bob, you'd 3 like to address that. The original contract, Mr. McCausland, MR. HIGHT: 5 provided for a one-year extension. That has been reviewed 6 by the Department of General Services, their Contracting 7 Office, and met with their approval. 8 MR. McCAUSLAND: Okay. I'll move adoption. 9 MS. SMITH: Second. 10 CHAIRMAN CORY: Moved and seconded. Is there 11 anybody in the audience on Item C -- Item 31 of the amended calendar, the contract with Condor Helicopters? 12 13 Approved as presented. 14 32. 15 EXECUTIVE OFFICER NORTHROP: Mr. Chairman, Item 16 Number 32 is a report to the Commission on negotiations 17 between the Staff, the City of Los Angeles, and the 18 Los Angeles Harbor Department. We are continuing negotiations 19 and will probably have them concluded prior to next month's 20 meeting. 21 CHAIRMAN CORY: Any questions by members? 22 33, authorizing the Executive Officer to conduct 23 a public hearing regarding the proposed oil and gas lease 24 in the bed of the Sacramento River, Sacramento and Yolo 25 Counties.

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۱ Is there anybody in the audience on Item 33? 2 Any questions from the members of the Commission? 3 Without objection, Item 33 will be approved as presented. 5 Item 34, Negative Declaration for exchange of 6 lands between Erickson Lumber Company and the State Lands 7 Commission, AKA De La Cruz Exchange. Is there anybody 8 in the audience on Item 34? 9 Any questions from members? 10 Without objection, we'll approve the Negative 11 Declaration as presented. Item 35. This is a request to delegate to the 12 Executive Officer authorization to issue temporary permits. 13 14 These are specified conditions because of the --EXECUTIVE OFFICER NORTHROP: Drought. 15 16 CHAIRMAN CORY: -- drought conditions. I think 17 we need emergency pipelines and those kinds of things. 18 Mr. Northrop is in the water selling business, I think. 19 (Laughter.) 20 CHAIRMAN CORY: Is there anybody who has any 21 questions on Item 35 in the audience? 22 MR. McCAUSLAND: I have a lot of questions. 23 CHAIRMAN CORY: Anything you want to discuss? 24 (Laughter.) 25 MS. SMITH: No.
