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3	CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: I think we're zeady to begin
4	here. This is the regular meeting of the State Lands
5	Commission.
6	The first order of business is to note that Mr. Jock
7	O'Connell will be sitting in a voting capacity for the
6	Lieutenant Governor and I will be sitting in a non-voting
9	capacity for the Controller.
10	If anyone wishes to address the Commission on any
11	item, there is a little half-page form that we would like you
12	to fill out and leave with the secretary here.
13	The first real order of business item is
14	confirmation of the minutes. Were there any questions on the
15	minutes of the meeting of July 24th?
16	The minutes are approved.
17	The second item on the agenda is the Report of the
18	Executive Officer.
19	EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Commissioners, I've
20	never really discussed this with you, but as a matter of
21	practice I have not been, as you've noticed, making Executive
22	Officer's Reports for some time,
23	The reason I have not done that is that the items
24	which have in the past been used in the Executive Officer's
25	Reports I've been putting on the calendar as informational
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items for you Therefore, I'm not making them and I have 1 never asked you whether you like that or not. So, I thought 2 today maybe I should. If I have something really big to tell 3 yor, I'll tell you. But if you'd prefer to go back to the Executive Officer format, I will. 5 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: I sort of like having the 6 7 informational items. EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: I thought you'd get more 8 information in a more manageable way that way. 9 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: I think that also helps our 10 communication with the public, because those items then 11 appear on our agenda. 12 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Are noticed, right. I m 13 glad you feel that way. That is what I had in mind, but I 14 apologize for never having discussed it with you. It kind of 15 evolved. I do not have an Executive Officer's --16 17 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Evolution is frequently 18 fruitful. 19 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Well, it's a good thing, 20 isn't it? CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Don't tell the apes that. 21 I should note, also, that there's six items that 22 have been takes off the calendar, off the agenda. Those are 23 items 34, 15, 21, 33, 34, and 35. 24 The next item of business is the Consent Calendar. 25

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These are Items Cl through C13 and they have been deemed to be relatively non-controversial and we will take them up as one unless there is someone who would like to pull any of those items out for discussion.

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Seeing no hands, no comments, the consent agenda is approved by consensus.

That brings us to Item 16.

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EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Commissioners, Item 16 is a termination of an existing lease and the installation of 9 a new lease -- approval of a new lease and the assignment of the new lease to a new lessee on a parcel of land in Seal Beach in Orange County. It's just barely in Orange County.

13 This is an area we've been trying to get developed. 14 At any rate, this is a parcel that we've been trying to get to this stage for a long, long time. There have been a lot 15 16 of people who have worked on it.

At any rate, it's not a controversial item at this 17 If you'd like more information on it, we'd be happy 18 point, to put that on. 19

20 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Are there any questions on Item 16, comments? 21

Sixteen is approved as presented.

Item 17, please.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 17 is approval of a 24 ten-year lease between the City of Eureka and Eureka 25

Redevelopment Agency for the purpose of a building yard for 1 2 constructing offshore oil platforms. CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 17? 3 Seventeen is approved as presented. Item 18. 5 6 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 18 is approval of 7 an amendment to a general lease to Naomie King which would protect the legal rights of those who are protesting her 8 9 right to have a lease. 10 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: I wondered where the name for the island came from. 11 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: You mean Bra's Island? 12 13 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Yeah. 14 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: All I can say is Mr. Trout is blushing, but silent. 15 16 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: That question doesn't really 17 deserve an answer. 18 CCMMISSIONER ORDWAY: You're sort of an interesting 19 shade of red, Mr. Trout. CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 18 is approved as 20 21 presenteā. 22 Item 19. 23 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 19. This is the 24 Wine Valley co-tenancy. Approve an extension of the 25 · construction limiting date on a marina in the Napa River.

4	EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: The County of Riverside.
5	Approval for the staff of State Lands and the Attorney

8	CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 20?
9 -	Twenty is approved as presented.
10	Twenty-one is off calendar
11	Item 22.
12	EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 22, TXO. It's
13	approval of the issuance of negotiated subsurface oil and gas
14	lease in the Sacramento River Channel on lands that are
15	surrounded by leases held by TXO.
16	CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 22?
17	Twenty-two is approved as presented.
18	Item 23.
19	EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Twenty-three, Fargo
20	Resources. Approval of extension of a permit to prospect for
21	minerals other than oll, gas and geothermal in San Bernardino
22	County.
23	CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 23?
24	Twenty-three is approved as presented.
25	Item 24

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Twenty-four, Draco 1 Mines-New Colosseum Mines. Acceptance of a quitclaim deed on 2 a prospecting permit in San Bernardino County. 3 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 24? 5 Approved as presented. Item 25. 6 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Utah International. 7 Approval of extension of a permit to prospect for minerals 8 other than oil and gas in Riverside County. And geothermal. 9 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 25? 10 Twenty-five is approved as presented. 11 Item 26. 12 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 26 is our 13 legislatively required semi-annual report on the conitoring 14 of subsidence and seismic hazards. Don Everitts is here to 15 point out for you on the record the current status of the 16 non-subsidence. 17 MR. EVERITTS: Justice prevails as usual. For 21 18 years we've continued to have no subsidence. We've had 19 uplifts, which is nine foot of uplift right here. As much as 20 nine foot of uplift here. The only subsidence at all is .1 21 foot, just a little over an inch, in 21 years off here on the 22 Island Grissom area. So, we're right as usual. 23 24 (Laughter.) 25 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Do we have to drain the

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uplift? We're allowed to make the land go higher, we're just 1 not allowed to let it go any lower. 2 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: The uplift is okay. The 3 modesty of the staff is outstanding, as I'm sure you 4 recognized. 5 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Can we use the nine feet of 6 increase to mitigate subsidence? Can we bank this? 7 MR. EVERITTS: Talk to APCD about that. 8 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: The Attorney General thinks 9 it's amusing. 10 MR. STEVENS: It's very positive. 11 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Keep up the good work. No pun 12 intended. 13 (Laughter.) 14 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 26 is approved as 15 presented. 16 Item 27. 17 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 27. This is an 18 informative item requested by the Commission on the status of 19 continued deferment of drilling on Chevron leases in Santa 20 21 Barbara County. CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 27? 22 Twenty-seven is approved as presented. 23 Item 28. 24 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Twenty-eight is again an 25

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informative item, the current status of the implementation of Mr. Elder's Bill 2568 on equity. The short answer is nothing has happened. The long answer you've read, I'm sure.

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CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: All right, thank you. I'm sure Mr. Elder would ordinarily be here. But with things being the way they are in the Legislature, he's not here.

7 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Commissioners, the 8 public is concerned. I think that we do well by putting the 9 existing status on every month so that you're informed and 10 that the people who are equity holders are aware that the 11 Commission continues to be aware of the situation and 12 continues to work on it.

CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: All right, thank you. There's no action required on that item.

> EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: None. CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 29.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 29 is the report of the actual revenues from the tidelands and from geothermal for the fiscal year 85-86 and the projected revenues for 86-87, 87-88.

COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: More good news, I assume.
 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yes, ma'am. It's
 wonderful news. The actual revenues were 425,381,000 from an
 estimated 465 million, which isn't all that awful considering
 that half the year is where the prize really dropped on us.

The proposed revenues are extremely low -- 82 million for 86-87 and 89 million for 87-88. There's two and a half pages of assumptions attached to that and I know that you understand the difficulties of trying to project at this point.

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The assumptions are based on the beginning prices of 6 8.10 in Long Beach and 5.75 in Elwood. There has been an 7 increase in posted price since this calendar item was 8 written, which may mean anything. The price is currently 9 9.10 at Long Beach and 6.40 at Elwood. There is no better 10 way that we can tel. you what's going on, as I'm sure you 11 12 understand.

COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL: Would you characterize 13 these as being the most conservative reasonable figures? 14 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yes, they're 15 conservative within a reasonable range.

COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL: And that the likely events in the next few months would, if anything, result in these 18 figures increasing rather than decreasing. 19

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: We certainly hope so. 20 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Only if you believe that the 21 price of oil is going to increase. 22

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: The figure last year of 23 the 465 million was a conservative estimate. Last year's 24 figure of 465 million was a conservative estimate based on 25

1 the information at that time. No one knew the price of oil 2 was going to take a dive in December. All I can say is 3 they're the most reasonable figures that we can come up with 4 with the current state of knowledge. They are not inflated 5 in either direction. 6 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL: Is staff interested in a 7 pool?

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EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: I don't know. That's a good question. Mr. Thompson, Moose, is in Russia right now. COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL: Negotiating.

COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Negotiating.

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12 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL: And you're going to
13 Shanghai, is this true?

14EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: I'm planning on it.15COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Thank you, I think.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yeah, right.

17 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: It would have been better to
18 do the subsidence report, the good news as small as it is,
19 after the bad news.

20 EXECUTIVE OF TCER DEDRICK: Should I have done it 21 that way?

CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Yeah.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Oh, okay.

24CHAIRPERSON RACMUSSEN: As a little pick-me-up for25Nancy.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: The little bit of 1 pick-me-up good news is Item 30, which is, again, the 2 approval of the final report on the closing statement of the 3 Long Beach plan and budget. That you know all about, I'm 4 The point is that the expenses are drastically reduced sure, 5 and we will be coming in with Item 31 which we'll tell you 6 about, which is just informative, with another modification 7 in September for a further reduction. That's the good news. 8 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Is the tracking to what we had 9 discussed back in June and July? 10 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yes. 11 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: We should note for the 12 record that we did approve Item 29. 13 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: I'd like you to approve 14 Item 30. I sort of went through three in a hurry here. 15 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Any questions on 30? 16 Thirty is approved as presented. 17 Thirty-one is an information scem. 18 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Right. Thirty-one is 19 the information item that we will be in with another 20 reduction in expenses proposed on that account in September. 21 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: All right, thank you. 22 Item 32. 23 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Thirty-two is a request 24 for reduction in the amount of letter of credit on a royalty 25

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1 oil sales contract for Huntway Refining Company as a result 2 of the decreased price of oil. CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 32? 3 Thirty-two is approved. Items 33, 34 and 35 are off calendar. That brings 5 us to Item 36. 6 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 36, Mr. Hight -- I 7 wish I hadn't started this mister stuff -- Bob is going to 8 9 talk about the legal items. COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Hight is going to talk about 10 11 Hyatt? MR. HIGHT: Yes. Item 36 is the approval of a land 12 bank and you'll also be acting as land bank trustees to 13 settle any Commission incerests in a 9.1 acre parcel in San 14 15 Francisco. 16 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Any questions on 36? Thirty-six is approved as presented. 17 Item 37. 18 MR. HIGHT: Thirty-seven is cession of concurrent 19 criminal jurisdiction to the Oakland Army Base for five 20 years. We held a hearing and nobody came. Nobody cared. 21 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Suppose we held a hearing 22 and no one came. 23 Item 37 is approved as presented. 24 25 Item 38.

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EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Is the authorization for 1 2 the staff in cooperation with the City of Emeryville to 3 conduct a public trust hearing in Emeryville concerning a grant to Emeryville. 4 5 CHAIRFERSON RASMUSSEN: Any questions on 38? COMMISSIONER OREWAY: Wait a minute, I have a 6 question. What parcel of state land is that? Is this where 7 all the statues are? 8 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Partly. Except for the 9 fact that the parcels -- that the statues are on tidelands 10 11 that are the dry part of the tide and the trust will cover that area and then on out onto the water, the trust exercise. 12 But then the sculptures are also on a parcel next to it 13 that's in the city limits of the City of Oakland. 14 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Oakland. 15 16 ... CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Any other questions or 17 comments? 18 Item 38 is approved as presented. 19 Is there any other business to come before the 20 Commission this morning?
