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1	<u>PROCEEDINGS</u>
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3	CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Bring the meeting to order.
4	This is the State Lands Commis on. The first item of
5	business is the minutes for the meeting of November 20, 1986.
6	Are there any questions, additions for the minutes?
7	The minutes are approved as presented.
8	Ms. Dedrick, would you please present the Report of
9	the Executive Officer.
10	EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: No report today, Madam
11	Chairman.
12	CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: That's the kind of report we
13	like.
14	EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yes, I understand that.
15	CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: The next item of business is
16	the Consent Calendar. It's Items Cl through Cl3. These are
17	items that have been deemed to be non-controversial. We'll
18	take then up with one motion unless there is someone who
19	would like to pull one of those items out for discussion
20	separately.
21	COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion.
22	CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: The consent agenda has been
23	approved as presented
24	EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Madam Chairman, oxcuse
25	me. There are some items that have been pulled from the

calendar. Would you like me to comment on those? 1 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Yes. 2 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: They are Items 14, 15, 3 18, 23 and 27. 4 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Did everyone hear that? 5 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Items 14, 15, 18, 23 and 24? 6 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Twenty-three and 27. We 7 would also ask that Item 26 be put over to the end of the 8 9 calendar. CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: All right. That will be how 10 we will proceed then. Items 14 and 15 then are off the 11 agenda. 12 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: That's correct. 13 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Our next item is Item 16. 14 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Chairman, this is the --15 Item 16 and 17 go to some extent together. The Item 16 is an 16 application by the River Bank Village and the River Bank 17 Holding Company for a lease on a parcel of land in the 18 Sacramentc River adjacent to a lease they already hold. 19 Item 17 is an application for that same group to 20 lease a 50-foot parcel in which they are in a trespass. 21 We have received a letter from the people in charge 22 of this organization -- Tom Westley, specifically -- asking 23 for an extension or proposing a 90-day extension on the 884 24 date on Item 17. 884 runs on the 1st of January. 25

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I suggest, Commissioners, that you accept that and also accept an extension, if they will offer it, on the Item 16 and under those circumstances put over the items so that we can negotiate a settlement.

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CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: All right, that's Items 16 and 17.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: That is correct. That would extend the 884 date on item -- I think you need to hear from Mr. Westley to be sure that this still works.

CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Yes, I have a request here from Mr. Westley, partner in the River Bank Holding Company and River Bank Village. It states that he wishes to request an extension of time to act on the application.

Did you wish to address the Commission?

EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: That would be Item 17, I
think, which would put that one over for three months. We
thought it would probably also be a good idea if they're
willing to give us an extension in case we need it on the
Item 16.

CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: These two items are related. Mr. Westley.

22 MR. WESTLEY: That would be fine with us,
23 Commissioners.

COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Move to put Items 16 and 17 on a 90-day extension.

CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: It's been moved and is 1 approved that these two items will be held, given a 90-day 2 3 extension. EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: That's all there is to it. 5 Thank you, Mr. Westley. 6 MR. WESTLEY: Thank you very much. 7 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 18 is off the agenda. 8 Item 19. 9 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 19 is a five-plac 10 rent review and approval of continuation of the rent with the 11 Santa Catalina Island Company on the piers and other 12 constructions at Isthmus Cove in Catalina Harbor. 13 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Any questions on Item 19? 14 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion. 15 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 19 is approved as 15 17 presented. Item 20. 18 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 20 is a letter to 19 authorize a continuation of a relatively low rent of \$550 a 20 year to Mr. Mel Wolf on his jojoba plantation for 21 continuation of one year. 22 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Any questions on item 20? 23 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion. 24 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 20 is approved as 25

1 presented. 2 Item 21. EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 21 is the approval 3 of an amendment of a 30-year lease in Contra Costa County to 4 5 change the rental. Cannery Cove Marina, Inc. 6 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion. 7 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 21 is approved as 8 presented. 9 Item 22. 10 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 22 is an 11 authorization of a temporary reduction of insurance from 12 \$1 million to \$500,000. Again, we have a client here who is having a very hard time neeting the Commission's insurance 13 14 requirements. 15 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Does that 500 provide enough 16 coverage? 17 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: It's the best we can do, 18 Nancy. It's what it was, Commissioner. What we are doing is 19 giving him an extension of that while he tries to get more 20 time in which to try to find the million dollars. 21 It's a general problem that's coming up more and 22 more frequently. As you know, we've discussed it briefly 23 with you. We have an in-house study ongoing. 24 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: How long is temporary? 25 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: For another year.

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1 MR. HIGHT: It's actually until he can get back to 2 us. We can make it for any time that we would like. We can 3 make it a time certain of six months or a year. COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: I feel more comfortable with 5 six months. We can bring it back and review it then. Move it at six months. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: When is the staff report 8 going to be done? 9 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Lance is in charge of 10 that. 11 MR. KILEY: The staff report should be in-house 12 circulating -- I would sepect to have something to say to the 13 Commission by the January meeting. 14 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: All right. 15 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: I think that's a little 16 premature. I would say more likely it will be February. I 17 don't think we'll have that kind of review time in January, 18 Lance, but it's a good try. 19 MR. KILEY: I defer to your greater wisdom. 20 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 22 is approved as 21 amended. 22 Item 23 is off the agenda. 23 Item 24. 24 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: This is an approval of a 25 sublease from Union Oil to the Point Pedernales Pipeline

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Company for the pipeline that they are constructing from the 1 offshore to Lompoc. 2 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Any questions on 24? 3 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion. CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 24 is approved as 5 presented. 6 Item 25. 7 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 25 is the approval 8 of a one-year Salvage Permit --9 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Twenty-five was off. 10 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: No, 27 is off. 11 Item 25 is approval of a one-year Salvage Permit to 12 a person who wants to look for a stagecoach full of gold that 13 apparently sank in the Owens Lake a good many years ago. 14 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: People really do that, huh? 15 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yes, ma'am. 16 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Hey, if he wants -- is it a he 17 or a she? 18 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Malcolm D. Stewart I 19 think is ---20 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: If Malcolm wants to go search 21 for a stagecoach of gold, far be it from us. I'll move it. 22 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Thank you. 23 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 25 is approved as 24 25 presented.

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Item 26 we will take up after we've completed the rest of the agenda.

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Item 27 is off calendar.

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So, that brings us to Item 28.

5 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 28, Commissioners, is a little bit complicated. At the last Commission meeting you put out a package of Royalty Oil for bid with a 25-cent 7 minimum. No bids were received and at the time that the 8 9 notice of this meeting went out, that was all the knowledge 10 that staff had. Therefore, the notification is for the 11 return of Royalty Oil to the Union Oil Company.

12 In the interim we have been notified of a 13 possibility to negotiate a price over the 25-cent minimum. 14 Union Oil has given us an extension of an extra month, which is the month of January, in order to work on this problem. 15

16 We would like you not to adopt the resolutions that are in the calendar item, but to give up permission to try to negotiate a price above the 25-cent minimum for this package of oil, report back to you in the January meeting.

20 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Any questions? 21 The oil market being what it is and changing daily --22

COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Fluid.

CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Yes, fluid.

COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: I'll move your recommendation.

1 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: I think your recommendation 2 is a good one. 3 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Thank you, Commissioners. 4 5 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 28 is approved as 6 amended. 7 Item 29. EXECUTIVE OFFICE, DEDRICK: Item 29 is consideration 8 9 of an agreement with the City of Long Beach to abandon the 10 Magnolia Drill Site, which is an old site for Parcel A that 11 is located in an area where the City has a chance to get a 12 very good, very productive lease for the tidelands for hotel 13 construction. 14 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Questions on 29? 15 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: You sort of pre-empted my guestion was going to be: When they close down 16 guestion. 17 the drill site, are they going to make it pretty? EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yes. 18 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: They're going to build a 19 20 hotel? EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yes. It's that parcel 21 that's across the street from the Hyatt Regency, the large 22 23 empty parcel there. COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Of course, they need another 24 25 hotel.

1 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: That would make it a lot 2 more -- well, it's connected to the Convention Center. So, 3 they see it as very profitable. CUMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion. Á. 5 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN Item 29 is approved as 6 presented. 7 Item 30. 8 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 30 is just a brief 9 report on the AB 2568, as the Commission has requested that 10 . we report to you. 11 A meeting was held at which Mr. Trout and Moose 12 Thompson attended with the oil comparies and the people from 13 the equity holders. All I can report at this point is that 14 the meeting was held, nobody killed anybody and we are 25 continuing to try to rind a way to resolve the problem. 16 CHAIRPERSON RASHUSSEN: My, things are looking up. 17 Any questions on Item 30? 18 Item 30 is approved as presented. 19 Item 31. 20 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 31 is the revenue 21 report to the Commission. As you can see, the number is up 22 from the last projection, which was \$82 million. We're up to 23 140 million; with an 87-88 current prediction of 120 million.

Mr. Thompson is here and if would you like him to give you some more detail on the subject, I'm sure he'd be

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happy to do so.

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COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: OPEC futures were at 17 yesterday?

MR. THOMPSON: I didn't see this morning's paper. But that's what they were yesterday, a little over \$17.

COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: When will that trickle down? No pun intended.

MR. THOMPSON: There's really no correlation to that. That's some degree of hedging or optimism on there. At the same time that they were guoting the futures market at \$17, the actual posted prices just went up from \$14 to 315.

12 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Is there any indication when they're going to try and put their squeeze on?

14 MR. THOMPSON: I just read the papers. Apparently 15 they're still trying to negotiate it. Apparently it seems to 16 me they're still trying to work on a RAC. The main problem 17 is just trying to get the oil back down enough in the 18 production rate.

19 They also have a storage problem that there's about 20 an extra 200 million barrels in storage. Even though they 21 cut back a million barrels a day, it takes time to soak it 22 up.

23 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: 1'11 move the adoption of the 24 updated revenue estimates.

CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: All right. It's better

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news, but still not the best news. Item 31 is approved as 1 2 presented. Item 32. 3 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 32 is the Fifth Modification of the Long Beach Plan and Budget, which 5 provides for the replacement of piping at one of the sites. 6 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Metions 7 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 32 is approved as 8 presented. 9 Item 33. 10 ERECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: The Sixth Modification 11 which revises the economic projections of --12 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: I'll move 33 and 34, The Sixth 13 and Seventh Modifications. 14 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: - Thank you. 15 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Items 33 and 34 are approved 16 17 as presented. Item 35 we need some additional language or 18 something here. 19 MR. HIGHT Yes, Madam Chairman. This morning we 20 have agreed upon -- staff and the representatives of the 21 Island Company have agreed upon a boundary line agreement and 22 lease-back and we would ask you to authorize the staff to put 23 that agreement into final form. 24 The terms are that we would agree on 30 acres at a 25

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49-year lease and the first five-year rent at seven percent 1 2 of the appraised value. 3 CHAIRPERSON KASMUSSEN: I have two attendance sheets here from Winfield Wilson, an attorney with the Santa 4 5 Catalina Company, and Roger Woolly, also with the Santa Catalina Island Company. They're here to answer questions 6 7 and comment if necessary. Are there any questions? 8 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: I have one question. 9 Roger, is that tentative agreement agreeable --10 that's agreeable to the company? 11 MR. WOOLLY: Yes, Commissioner, if it's agreeable 12 and acceptable by you. 13 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: I'll move it. 14 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 35 is approved as 15 presented by Mr. Hight. 16 Item 36. 17 MR. HIGHT: Item 36 is the authorization to settle 18 litigation to a boundary line and a lease-back at the Beach 19 Club at Santa Monica. 20 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion. 21 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Ouestions on 36? 22 Item 36 is approved as presented. 23 Item 37. 24 MR. HIGHT: Item 37 is the authorization to --25 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion.

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1 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 37 is approved as 2 presented. 3 Item 38. A MR. HIGHT: Is authorization to execute contracts 5 for geohazards and consultant services. 6 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Any questions on 38? 7 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Motion. 1 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: Item 38 is approved as 9 presented. 10 That brings us back to Item 26. Are we prepared to 11 discuss Item 26? 12 MR. HIGHT: Let's put it over. CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: You think you need some 13 additional time? You want to remove it from the calendar and 14 bring it up at a -- ' 15 COMMISSIONER ORDWAY: Can we just put it to the 16 17 January meeting? 18 MR. HIGHT: Yes. 19 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Yes, I think that's the thing to do. We just haven't received word back on a 20 potential agreement. 21 22 CHAIRPERSON RASMUSSEN: There's no problems with our AB 884 or any deadlines? 23 24 EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: No, that one's okay. COMMISSIONER O DWAY: I have only one matter of 25
