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## PROCEEDINGS

ACTING CHAIRMAN McCARTHY: Minutes of the last Commission meeting?

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER TROUT: No.

We'd just like you to consider three items this morning and we'll let you get on your way.

Governor, we appreciate you and Mr. Ziegler being here to handle these few little items we want to wrap up.

If I may proceed.

The first item has to do with approval and certification of a negative declaration for capping abandoned wells in Summerland, Santa Barbara County, that have been seeping.

And Gavin Payne from Assemblyman O'Connell's office is here to make a statement and provide the Commission with some information.

ACTING CHAIRMAN McCARTHY: Welcome. You can use this one. Is there a button there?

MR. PAYNE: Yes. I think it's on, too. Mike is on.

Good morning. My name is Kevin Payne. I'm with Assemblyman O'Connell's office.

I have here a letter that I won't go through all the way. It's a letter from both Assemblyman O'Connell and Senator Gary Hart praising the Commission on the work so far

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on cleaning up the seeps in the Summerland area, encouraging future action along those lines, particularly there.

That's it. Short but sweet.

Thank you.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER TROUT: We recommend approval.

ACTING CHAIRMAN McCARTHY: Anything else you want to say about this?

We approve the recommendation.

Next.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER TROUT: Mr. Chairman,
Item No. 2 is execution of contracts with the University of
California at Davis and the Great Basin Unified Air
Pollution Control District to provide services for looking
at alternatives for mitigation of dust at Owens Lake.

Part of this money is provided by the State and part by the Los Angeles City Department of Water and Power.

The dust at Owens Lake has been a long time problem and the Commission has for years been working with the Great Basin District to find some kind of permanent solution.

The experts at the University of California have come up with some alternatives and this would allow the testing of some of those alternatives on site.

We recommend approval.

ACTING COMMISSIONER ZIEGLER: Just one question, 1 Jim. 2 3 I understand the work is supposed to start on July ist. 5 Do we have a forecast date of completion and sort of dividing out some of the experimental technologies with 6 7 when the project should be done? ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER TROUT: They'll be 8 started over a period of a year and they will be worked on 9 even after that to fine-tune them. 10 11 We don't have a completion date, but this is part of a continuing phase project cut there to find a solution. 12 13 There are also other solutions that are going to 14 be tested by the Great Basin District using other contractors at the same time. 15 ACTING COMMISSIONER ZIEGLER: And we have a 16 17 current-year appropriation of 150,000 and then that's all the State money that's at stake here? 18 19 ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER TROUT: Currently available. That's correct. 20 21 ACTING COMMISSIONER ZIEGLER: Okay. ACTING CHAIRMAN MCCARTHY: Any member of the 22 23 public have anything stunning to say about this issue? ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER TROUT: 24 I'm sorry, 25 sir?

ACTING CHAIRMAN McCARTHY: I'm just asking if any member of the public would like to speak.

If not, approved as recommended.

No. 3.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER TROUT: Okay. Item
No. 3, Mr. Chairman, is for the GTE California Incorporated
to do two things.

They have in existing conduits under the Georgianna Slough in Walnut Grove. They propose to put in upstream or downstream from those existing conduits new conduits and ultimately abandon the conduits that are existing there now. It's for telecommunications facilities.

And we recommend approval.

ACTING CHAIRMAN McCARTHY: Any questions?

Approved as recommended.

That's it.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER TROUT: Thank you.

ACTING CHAIRMAN McCARTHY: Thank you.
